SUBJECT: Adoption of a Resolution Establishing Camino del Mar Between Seaview Avenue and Luzon Avenue as an Undergrounding Project District to Utilize SDG&E Rule 20A Funding

REQUESTED ACTION/RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council conduct a public hearing and adopt the attached Resolution (Attachment A) designating a certain portion of Camino del Mar between Seaview Avenue and Luzon Avenue as an Undergrounding Project District.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS:

The City of Del Mar is actively planning to underground all utility poles citywide. At the City Council meeting on April 15, 2019, staff presented a recommended plan to move forward. While there was Council direction to further research several topics related to the overall program, there was Council support for the recommendation of the Undergrounding Project Advisory Committee (UPAC) to move forward with undergrounding several poles along Camino del Mar (CDM) designated as eligible to be paid for using Rule 20A funding.

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) has an established regulation, known as Rule 20, which pertains to undergrounding of utility poles. Rule 20A projects are typically in areas of a community that are used most by the public and are completed by and paid for 100% by SDG&E. To qualify, the City Council must determine, after holding a public hearing on the subject, that undergrounding in the designated area is in the public interest for one or more of the following reasons:

- Undergrounding will avoid or eliminate an unusually heavy concentration of overhead electric facilities.
- The street, road, or right-of-way is extensively used by the public and carries a heavy volume of pedestrian or vehicular traffic.
- The street, road, or right-of-way adjoins or passes through a civic area, public recreation area, or an area of unusual scenic interest to the public.
- The street, road, or right-of-way is considered an arterial street or major collector as defined in the Governor's Office of Planning and Research General Plan Guidelines.

City Council Action:

Council adopted Resolution 2019-41, "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DEL MAR, CALIFORNIA, ESTABLISHING AN UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT IN THE CITY OF DEL MAR, ON CAMINO DEL MAR (BETWEEN SEAVIEW AVENUE AND LUZON AVENUE)", on Consent.

In order to form an underground utility district, Chapter 23.54 of the Del Mar Municipal Code requires a three-step process. The first step was completed at the City Council meeting on July 15, 2019, when the City Council adopted a resolution calling for a public hearing to determine whether public health, safety or welfare requires undergrounding, with the City Clerk providing notice of the hearing to all affected property owners. The second required step is for the Council to hold a public hearing and adopt a resolution designating the area to be included in the district and determining that the removal of the aboveground facilities is necessary based on findings related to public health, safety or general welfare.

As the third and final next step, the Council will be asked to establish a project schedule by resolution which identifies the date by which properties in an established undergrounding district must be ready to receive underground service and by which poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures shall be removed. Once a district is formed, it becomes unlawful to construct or maintain aboveground facilities beyond the date established by the City for removal of such facilities.

The proposed area for the Rule 20A project is approximately 250 feet along CDM between Seaview Avenue and Luzon Avenue (Attachment A, Exhibit A). SDG&E has indicated that this work does not impact any property owners, i.e. there are no private service laterals involved. Shortly after the receipt of the City's Resolution to establish the undergrounding district, SDG&E will begin the project design, followed by conversion work and removal of poles, which could last approximately two years.

The City's annual allocation for Rule 20A funding from SDG&E is approximately \$68,000, which may be advanced up to five years for an estimated total of \$340,000. This amount is not enough to complete all of the 20A-eligible areas within the City. However, it may fund the removal of approximately three poles along CDM.

As a Rule 20A project, SDG&E will be responsible for 100% of the undergrounding conversion costs for the designated area, including design, construction, and coordination with the property owners. Though there will be minimal direct costs to the City, there will be staff time required for project coordination with SDG&E.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The staff time and minimal direct costs to the City associated with the Rule 20A work will be covered by funds already available in the Utility Undergrounding Project budget.

NEXUS TO CITY COUNCIL GOALS AND PRIORITIES:

The Undergrounding Project is a City Council priority project.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT:

The proposed action does not constitute a "project" under the California Environmental Quality Act, per the CEQA guideline definition.

PRIOR CITY COUNCIL REVIEW:

The City Council has discussed the UP several times, most recently:

- On April 15, 2019, when the City Council received a number of recommendations from the UPAC and directed the Project Team to return to City Council with additional information on the cost estimates and prioritization of the project areas.
- On July 15, 2019, when City Council adopted a resolution calling for public hearing on the designation of the subject area and authorized staff to proceed with the work in coordination with SDG&E.

RESOLUTION NO. 2019-__

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DEL MAR, CALIFORNIA, ESTABLISHING AN UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT IN THE CITY OF DEL MAR, ON CAMINO DEL MAR (BETWEEN SEAVIEW AVENUE AND LUZON AVENUE)

WHEREAS, on July 15, 2019, the City Council of the City of Del Mar called for and provided notice of a public hearing to ascertain whether the public health, safety, or welfare requires the removal of poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures, and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, or similar or associated service, within the certain area of the City as shown on Exhibit "A", a map entitled "Camino del Mar Utility Undergrounding 20A District;" and

WHEREAS, the proposed underground utility district is proposed to be funded in whole or in part through funding under Tariff Rule 20 of the California Public Utilities Commission; and

WHEREAS, notice of such hearing has been given to all affected property owners as shown on the last equalized assessment roll and to all utilities concerned in the manner and for the time required by law; and

WHEREAS, on August 5, 2019, the City Council of the City of Del Mar held a duly noticed public hearing, at which time all persons interested were given an opportunity to be heard and were heard.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Del Mar hereby finds and determines that the public health, safety, and welfare requires the removal of poles, overhead wires and associated structures, and underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication and similar or associated services in the district as shown on the attached exhibit map and that, pursuant to Del Mar Municipal Code Chapter 23.54, the area described as Camino del Mar between Seaview Avenue and Luzon Avenue is hereby designated and declared an Underground Utility District of the City of Del Mar. The boundaries of said district are delineated on Exhibit "A" and hereby incorporated as part of this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council does hereby order the removal of all poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures, and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, and similar or associated service within the Underground Utility District. The time within which property in said district must be ready to receive underground service and by which poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures shall be removed shall be set by subsequent resolution, pursuant to Section 23.54.030 of the Municipal Code.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk is hereby directed to:

1. Notify all affected property owners as shown on the last equalized assessment rolls, and all affected utilities, of the adoption of this Resolution within ten (10) days after the date of such adoption.
2. Cause a certified copy of this Resolution to be recorded in the office of the County Recorder for the County of San Diego.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council hereby finds that the Underground Utility District herein created is in the general public interest and eligible for funding in whole or in part through funding under Tariff Rule 20 of the California Public Utilities Commission for the following reasons:

1. The undergrounding to be accomplished will avoid or eliminate an unusually heavy concentration of overhead distribution facilities;
2. The street, roads, or rights-of-way in the District are extensively used by the general public, and carry a heavy volume of pedestrians or vehicular traffic; and
3. The said street, roads, or rights-of-way adjoin or pass through a civic area.

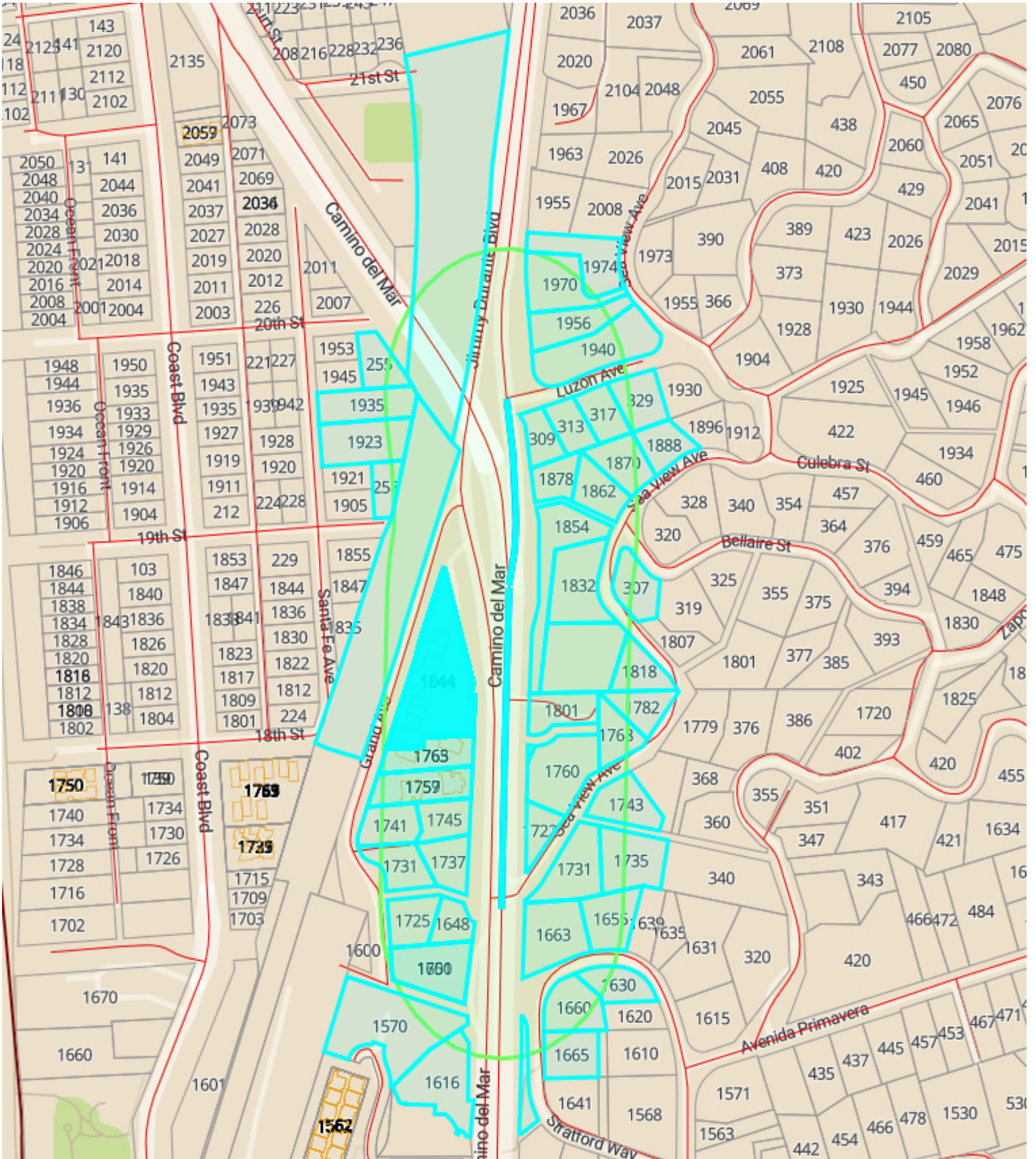

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on August 5, 2019 the City Council conducted a public hearing on the following:

Ascertaining whether to designate a certain area of the City, generally described as Camino del Mar starting between Seaview Avenue and Luzon Avenue, as a utility undergrounding district subject to CPUC Rule 20A funding and in accordance with Section 23.54.030

The City Council adopted a Resolution 2019-41 (Exhibit A) which forms the undergrounding district identified above. Therefore, it has now become unlawful to construct or maintain aboveground facilities beyond the to-be-determined city-established date for removal of such facilities. In the future, the City Council will establish the project schedule by adopting a third and final resolution.

Background Information

The City of Del Mar is developing a plan to underground all overhead utilities and to remove the poles citywide. Information about the status of the City's plan is available on the project web page at www.delmar.ca.us/up.

A limited amount of utility wires/poles are eligible to be removed using Rule 20A funds through San Diego Gas & Electric (SDG&E), and the City is embarking on the necessary process to begin. Available Rule 20A funding for the City of Del Mar is very limited.

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) has an established regulation, known as Rule 20, which pertains to undergrounding of utility poles. Rule 20A projects are typically in areas of a community that are used most by the public and are completed by and paid for in full by SDG&E. To qualify, the City Council must determine after holding a public hearing on the subject, that undergrounding in the designated area is in the public interest for one or more of the following reasons:

- Undergrounding will avoid or eliminate an unusually heavy concentration of overhead electric facilities.
- The street, road, or right-of-way is extensively used by the public and carries a heavy volume of pedestrian or vehicular traffic.
- The street, road, or right-of-way adjoins or passes through a civic area, public recreation area, or an area of unusual scenic interest to the public.

- The street, road, or right-of-way is considered an arterial street or major collector as defined in the Governor's Office of Planning and Research General Plan Guidelines.

In order to form an underground utility district, Chapter 23.54 of the Del Mar Municipal Code requires a three-step process:

1. The first step, was completed at the July 15th City Council meeting, when the City Council adopted a resolution calling for the public hearing on August 5, 2019 to determine whether public health, safety or welfare requires undergrounding, with the City Clerk providing notice of the hearing to all affected property owners.
2. The second step was completed on August 5, 2019 when the City Council held the public hearing and designated the subject area as an undergrounding district by adoption of the attached resolution.
3. As the third and final next step, in the future, the City Council will be asked to establish a project schedule by resolution which identifies the date by which properties (if any) in an established undergrounding district must be ready to receive underground service and by which poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures shall be removed.

The proposed area for the Rule 20A project is approximately 250 feet along Camino del Mar between Seaview Avenue and Luzon Avenue (attached to Exhibit A). Shortly after receipt of the third and final City's Resolution to establish the timeline, SDG&E will begin the project design, followed by conversion work and removal of poles. This work could last approximately two years and will be fully paid by SDG&E.



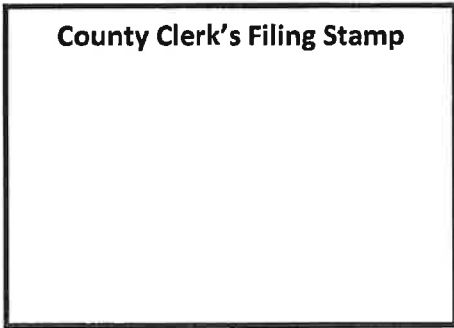


